Sub: New regulatory requirements for import of aquatic animals to Canada - reg.

Sir,

EIC has been informed by Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India, that Canada's new regulation for import of aquatic animals has come in to force with effect from 10th December 2012. The details of regulation can be viewed from the link given below.

It may be kindly be noted that fish & fishery products entering Canada without certification after the date of enforcement of new regulation may be refused entry.

In this regard, I am directed to request you to inform SEAI and approved processors to contact EIC /EIAs for certification before exporting fish & fishery products to Canada.

The scope of commodities impacted by the new permit requirements, unless exempt (*Health of Animals Regulations*, Part XVI, Aquatic Animals, Sections 192 and 193 and Importation of Pet Aquatic Animals) include live aquatic animals and their germplasm imported for all purposes (e.g. aquaculture, bait, research and diagnosis, aquarium trade, food and processing). In addition, permits will be required for dead aquatic animal carcasses, parts of carcasses and their offal that are imported for use as bait, manufacturing of feed, direct feeding to other aquatic animals, research, testing and diagnosis and processing where effluent or offal is produced.

Commodities excluded from the scope of the *Regulations* include dead aquatic animals that are eviscerated and aquatic animals that are processed, packed or ready to eat.
